### Headteacher's Message

With language, art and drama exams under our belts, we are truly in examination season as we count down to the first whole cohort GCSE exam. Year 13 students will mark the end of formal lessons with a Leavers' Tea on Friday 10th May and a more formal celebration on 25th June, to which parents are invited.

Pupils in Year 11 will continue to attend all lessons in all subjects until May half term. After this point, they will continue attending lessons until they have taken all of the exams in that subject. This was explained to pupils and families in September, and I am grateful to parents for supporting pupils in the final stages of their preparation.

## Table Talk: topics and questions from Religious Studies

In Year 9, pupils have been learning about the objects of devotion in synagogues and Jewish worship. They have learnt about the significance of the Torah ark as well as other aspects of the synagogue, such as a menorah and bimah. From understanding prayer rituals, to the symbolism behind each object of devotion, their knowledge has deepened, leading to a greater understanding of the Jewish faith and tradition.


### Christian Union Summer Party - Thursday 13th June
