Final DofE Silver Checklist

A reminder to parents/carers of Silver participants that the practice expedition in West Sussex is next week. To help your child prepare, please ensure that:

- you have paid the expedition fee on ParentPay (which includes the practice and assessed expedition)
- you have filled in the form on ParentPay with details on how your child will get home from Amberley station
- your child has borrowed any kit they need from the school store, and handed in the £10 cash deposit per item
- your child has their entire kit packed and ready (see previous letters with suggested kit list)
- your child has appropriate footwear and clothing for the three days of walking
- your child has brought appropriate meals (hot meals for the evening, simple breakfast, sandwiches/packed lunches for during the day) for each day
- your child's phone is fully charged (there will be no charging points on the trip, a portable battery is also advised but not compulsory)

Our starting point is 10am at Amberley train station on **Wednesday 15th May**. Please make arrangements for your child to be dropped off or to take a train which arrives at the station in time. The same for the return, leaving at 2.30pm from Amberley train station on **Friday 17th May**. The finishing time is provisional and based on how successful participants are with their navigation, so your child may contact you on Friday to let you know if they arrive earlier or later than planned.

Table Talk: topics and questions from Religious Studies

This week, our Year 12 students started studying a topic on how Christians view and understand the Bible. Additionally, students began to grasp the concept that different sections of the Bible serve distinct purposes and pondered the role of influences, such as tradition, in shaping one's interpretation of the Bible.


