Theme of the Week: Glorifying God - In Faith

Dear Parents and Carers,

Warm greetings to you. This week, we explored what it means to 'Glorify God: in Faith' in house assemblies. The writer of the book of James puts it much better than I ever could:

"What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. But someone will say, "You have faith; I have deeds." Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by my deeds." (James 2:14-18)

Very challenging words which we all need to hear and be reminded of.

In year assemblies, the 10:10 series looked at 'kindness' this week. Pupils and students will be familiar with this because it is part of the 'Fruits of the Spirit,' but hopefully they will gain new insights from the video that was included in the content. Please do see if you can tease out anything of what they remember from Collective Worship this week.

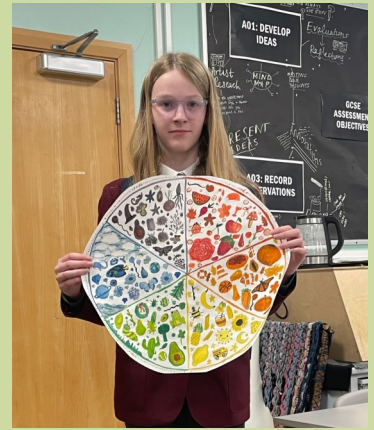
We value your prayers as we go into this last week of the first half term of the year!

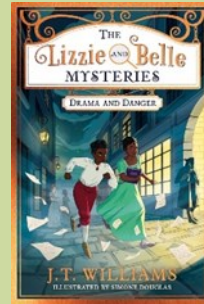
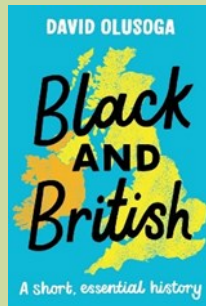
Library News

English lessons in the Library

Over the past two weeks, Years 8 and 9 have all visited the Library in their English lessons. They have listened to excerpts from books by Black authors and browsed the Library collection and read quietly.

Year 9s listened to a chapter from '*When Our Worlds Collided*' – which won the YA Book Prize earlier this year. Danielle Jawando's book follows three teenagers brought together when they witness the stabbing of a fourteen-year-old outside a busy shopping centre.

The introduction to David Olusoga's '*Black and British*' (youth version) highlights some lesser known Black people who lived in Britain in the eighteenth century. One of these, Dido Elizabeth Belle, features in a new fiction series by JT Williams called '*The Lizzie and Belle Mysteries*'.

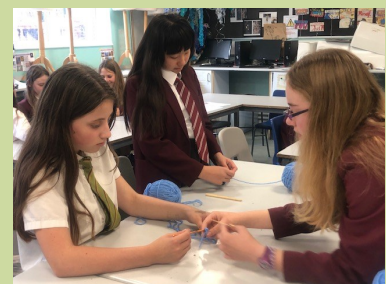

Google HQ



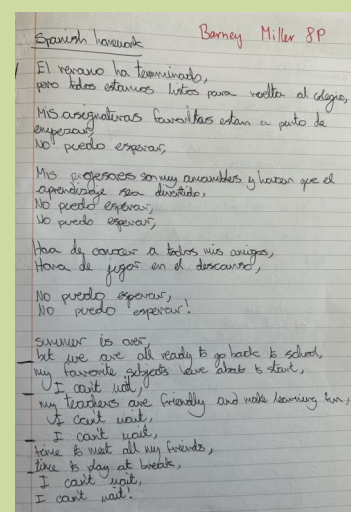
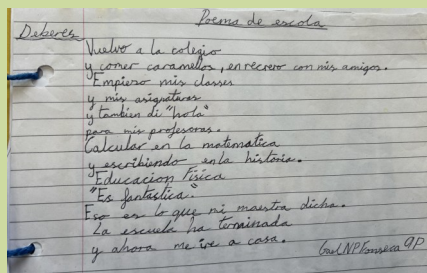

A national language competition is taking place in November. Teams of four will score points by tackling a variety of fun, language-themed challenges hosted on a national online platform.



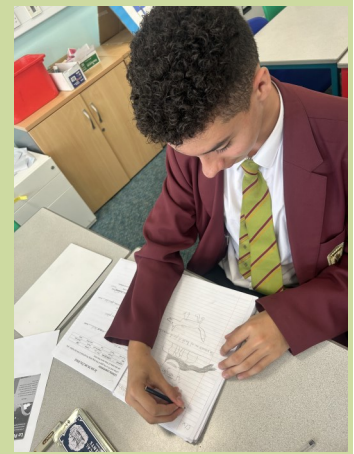
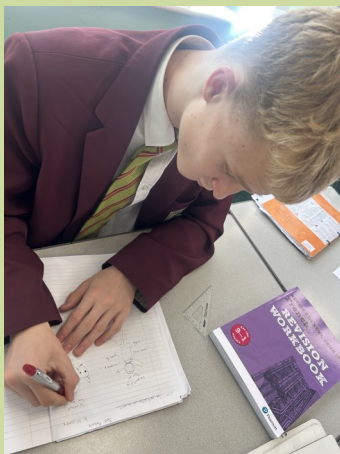

Year 11 Netball - Tournament Winners!

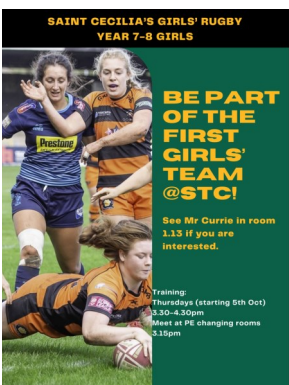
